A family assessment is conducted within 24 - 48 hours for non-system or voluntary youth. Maximum length of stay is up to 21 days for non-system youth & 45 days for courtordered youth (can be extended upon request & approval). Capacity is 17 youth. Family & individual counseling is available to families & youth.

Provides a supportive environment where residents can practice sobriety, learn recovery skills and integrate themselves back into the community. Facility is male only. Maximum length of stay is 9 months. Capacity is 40 persons. Program fees are \$350 per month.
